



Thoughtful Daisies

Made by Joanne Cantrell, Independent Stampin' Up Demonstrator
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Supplies:

- **Stamp Sets:** Daisy Delight (143669)
- **Paper:** Whisper White Cardstock (100730), Old Olive Cardstock (100703); Daffodil Delight Cardstock (119683); Medium Envelope – Whisper White (107301)
- **Inks:** Old Olive Classic Stampin' Pad (126953); Daffodil Delight Classic Stampin' Pad (126944); Calypso Coral Classic Stampin' Pad (126983); Tuxedo Black Memento Pad (132708)
- **Embellishments:** 3/8" Mini Chevron Ribbon – Old Olive (114196); 1/4" Double-Stitched Ribbon – Daffodil Delight (144116); Solid Baker's Twine – Whisper White (124262)
- **Adhesives:** Dimensionals (104430); SNAIL Adhesive (104332); Glue Dots (103683)
- **Non-SU:** 3 Post-it Notes (3" x 3")

Measurements:

- **Whisper White:** 5-1/2" x 4-1/4" card base (landscape-top fold); 1-3/4" x 2-1/2"
- **Old Olive:** 3-1/2" x 2"
- **Daffodil Delight:** 2" x 2-3/4"

Instructions:

1. Cut and score all pieces as indicated above. Also, cut approximately 5" of the Old Olive ribbon, 18" of White Twine, and 2" of the Daffodil ribbon.
2. Stamp 3-4 leaves on two the sticky part of two of the Post-It notes. Fussy cut (cut out near the lines). These will be used for masking.
3. Use Memento ink to stamp the sentiment at the bottom of the small white piece of cardstock. Wait a couple seconds to dry, then place the sticky end of the Post-It over the sentiment. This will allow you to do the rest of the stamping without covering the sentiment.
4. Use Old Olive to stamp the stems on the small Whisper White piece. Then use the green ink to stamp the tops of the fern-like plant. [This is meant to go over the stems – not over them like a flower].
5. Use Calypso Coral ink to stamp the flowers on the end stem. Make sure the flowers are right side up so they fit right.
6. Use Daffodil Delight to stamp the two-step daisy. First, stamp the solid base using the stamping off technique. Then stamp the petals using the ink full-strength.
 - a. Stamping Off: Just like it sounds... ink your stamp as you normally would, then stamp once onto a piece of scrap paper. Then, stamp your project. This applies a lighter shade of the color.
7. Use SNAIL to attach this white cardstock to the Daffodil Delight cardstock piece. Use glue dots to attach the ends of the yellow ribbon to the side of the yellow cardstock just above center. Set aside.
8. Use Old Olive ink to stamp 3-4 leaves on the card front. You can use the green cardstock as a guide so you don't place them so they are fully covered 😊. Place the leaf masks you made earlier over the images on the card front. This will protect them from the next step.
9. Use the yellow ink to stamp a couple daisies around the card front. Remove the masks from the leaves. Use the Daisy stamp and Daffodil Delight ink to stamp flowers around the edge of the inside of the card and set aside. Use same stamp and ink to stamp on the envelope so it's not naked!
10. Lightly drag each edge of the Old Olive cardstock across the ink pad – this will apply a little ink to the edges to add texture and interest. Wrap Whisper White Baker's Twine around the bottom-ish of the cardstock adhering the ends on the back. Use two glue dots to attach Old Olive ribbon above the twine.
11. Assemble card using Dimensionals.


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
